Context

The Sixth Global Conference on the Elimination of Child Labour will provide an opportunity to take stock of the progress achieved and the challenges encountered since the Fifth Global Conference. It will promote peer learning, information-sharing, cooperation and policy coherence within and among Member States at regional and international levels. It will also play a central role in shaping collective action in response to the failure to achieve Sustainable Development Goal target 8.7, which calls for the elimination of child labour by 2025, and will contribute to the development of processes envisaged for the post-2030 period.

The Sixth Global Conference will offer an opportunity to review the implementation of the outcomes of the Second World Summit for Social Development, scheduled for November 2025, with regard to child labour and its root causes. In doing so, it is expected to strengthen the commitment of all stakeholders to intensify efforts to eliminate child labour and to enhance coherence in action at national, regional and global levels.

The Sixth Global Conference will also provide an opportunity to highlight the links between the elimination of child labour and other fundamental principles and rights at work; to reinvigorate action in support of fundamental principles and rights at work and encourage new commitments in this regard, notably through the Global Coalition for Social Justice; and to leverage advocacy and cooperation activities through partnerships such as Alliance 8.7, global business-led initiatives, and the Global Accelerator on Jobs and Social Protection for Just Transitions.

Concept

Education as the core visual theme

The depiction of two children reading symbolises access to knowledge, recognised as the only sustainable means of breaking the cycle of child labour. This graphic choice positions education as a fundamental pillar of dignity, autonomy and child protection.

A clear and structured visual contrast

The lower band illustrating different forms of child labour establishes a direct contrast with the reading scene. This visual device highlights the tension between ongoing exploitation and the fundamental right to education. The graphic system reinforces the urgency of the message while guiding interpretation towards a positive outcome.

A visual narrative based on progression

The upward composition—from forced labour to access to knowledge—expresses a collective trajectory: moving away from exploitation, advancing towards education and projecting a fairer future. This visual progression reflects the purpose of the Conference: translating commitment into concrete action.

A forward-looking institutional visual identity

The illustration functions as a key reference within the Conference's visual identity. It defines a framework for reflection, dialogue and international engagement, in which child protection and access to education are established as strategic priorities. The overall system conveys a constructive and mobilising vision.

Alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals

The visual concept is embedded within the SDG framework, notably SDG 4 (quality education) and target 8.7, which calls for the elimination of child labour in all its forms. It strengthens the Conference's institutional positioning within the United Nations framework.

A controlled and institutional visual impact

The central protective figure structures the composition and directs visual focus. The neutral treatment of silhouettes enables an inclusive and universal representation, consistent with institutional communication standards.

A sober, contemporary and adaptable graphic language

The clean vector style defines an institutional graphic language designed to ensure clarity, consistency and adaptability across all communication media, including digital platforms, publications, signage and media outputs.



Logotype

Horizontal and vertical versions

The logotype is available in two orientations—horizontal and vertical—to ensure optimal use across all communication media.

Each version must be selected according to the format, the available space and the specific legibility and visibility requirements of each application.

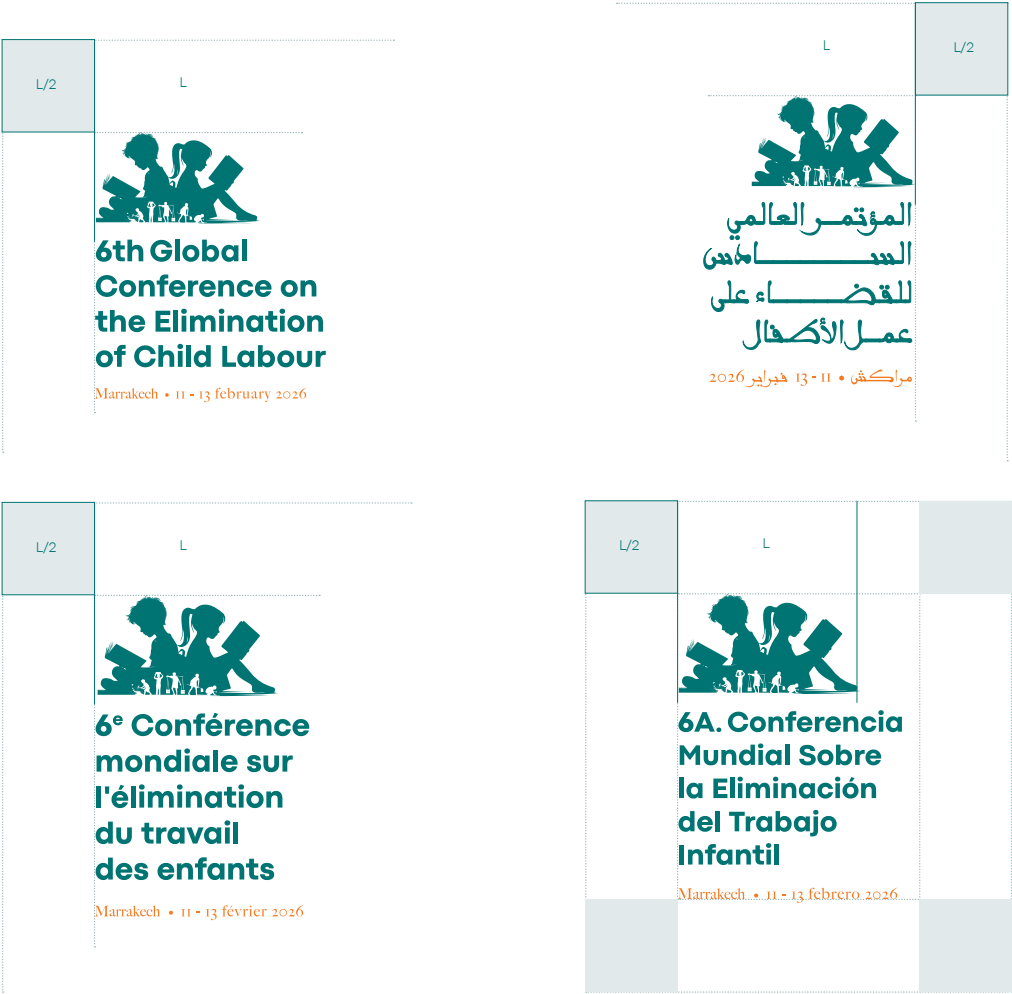

Logotype

Clear space vertical version

The logotype is available in four languages: English, Arabic, French and Spanish. For each language version, the clear space around the logotype must be respected in order to ensure legibility and visual impact.

This clear space is defined as half the width of the symbol and must remain free of any other graphic elements or text.



Logotype

Clear space horizontal version

The logotype is available in four languages: French, English, Arabic and Spanish. For each of these language versions, the clear space must be equal to half the height of the symbol.

This minimum margin must be maintained around the logotype to ensure optimal visibility and to prevent any interference with other graphic or typographic elements.



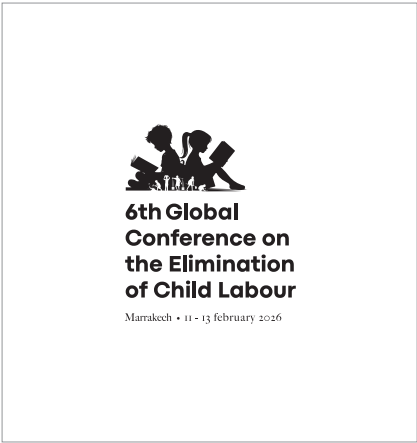
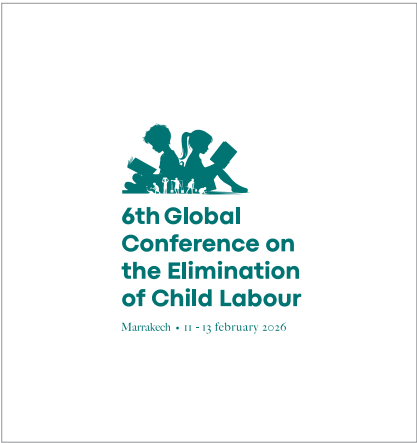

Positive and negative applications

The logotype may be used in monochrome, in mixed colours, or in black and white, on either a positive or a negative background.

All variations must ensure legibility, contrast, and preservation of the symbol's visual integrity.

The following are some recommended application examples.



Graphic pattern

For the Sixth Global Conference on the Elimination of Child Labour, hosted this year by Morocco, the visual identity incorporates a texture inspired by traditional Moroccan geometric patterns.

This composition, derived from zellige art and the ornamental structures characteristic of Moroccan architecture, provides a strong and immediately recognisable cultural dimension.

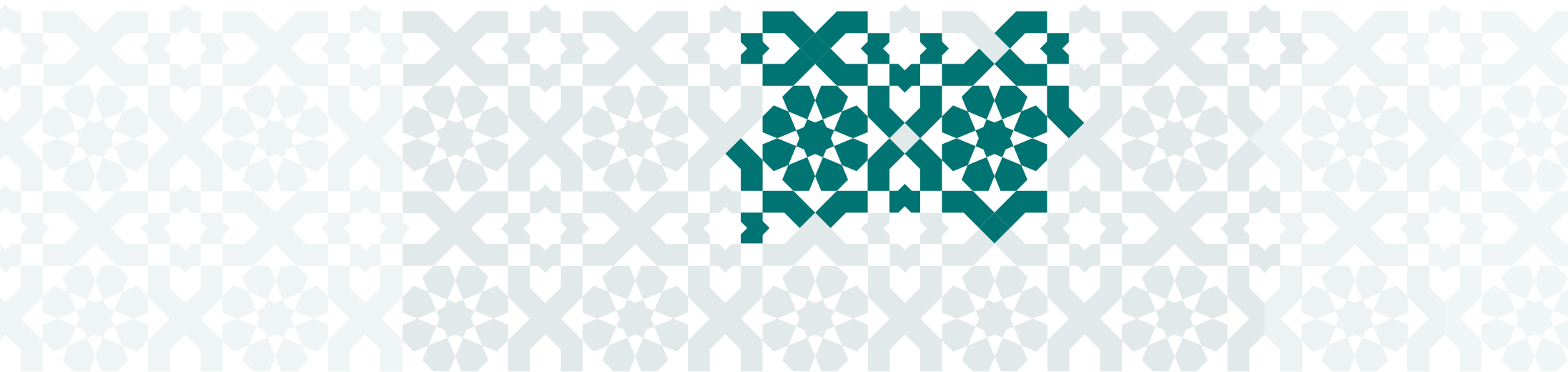
The patterns are rendered in a sober, institutional colour palette, allowing versatile use across different media.

Typography

The official typography for the Sixth Global Conference on the Elimination of Child Labour is based on two complementary type families, designed to cover all linguistic requirements of the event.

For Latin-based languages (French, English, Spanish), the typeface Codec Pro is used. This contemporary sans-serif typeface offers excellent legibility and versatility. Its balanced geometry and wide range of weights allow

effective structuring of information, from headings to body text, while ensuring a coherent and modern visual identity.

For Arabic, the official typeface is B Hakim Ghazali, an elegant and readable font, suited to institutional materials and multilingual communication. It achieves perfect visual harmony with Codec Pro while respecting the typographic specificities of the Arabic language.

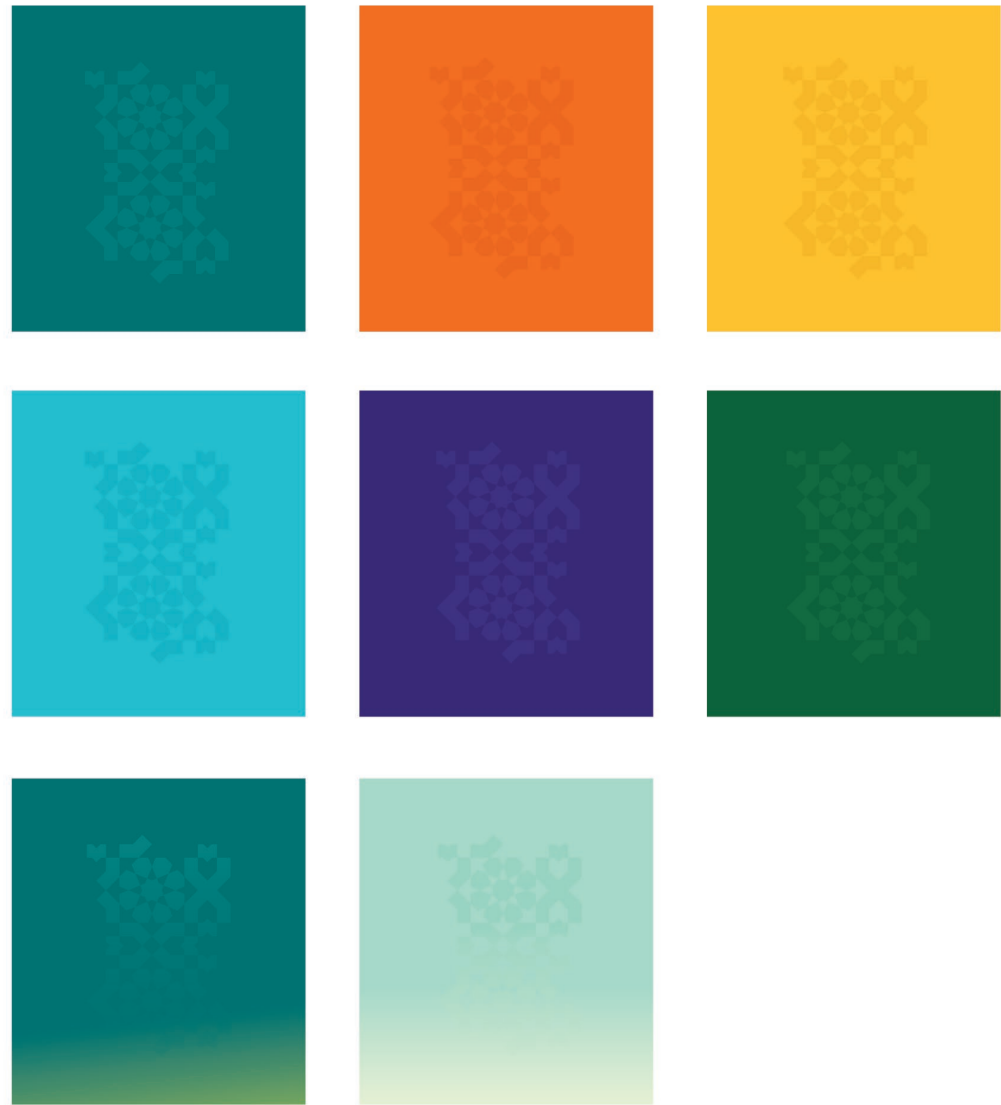
Colours

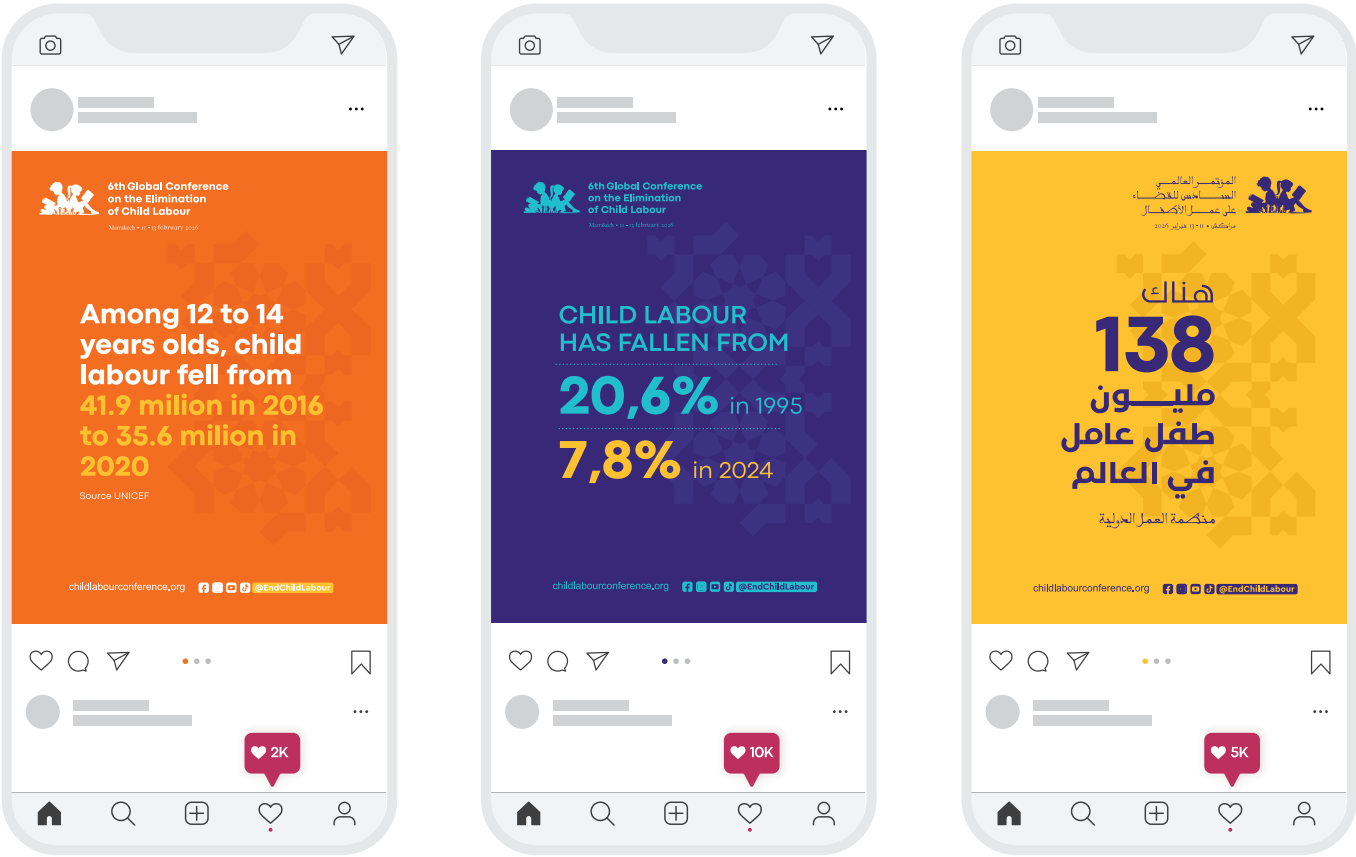

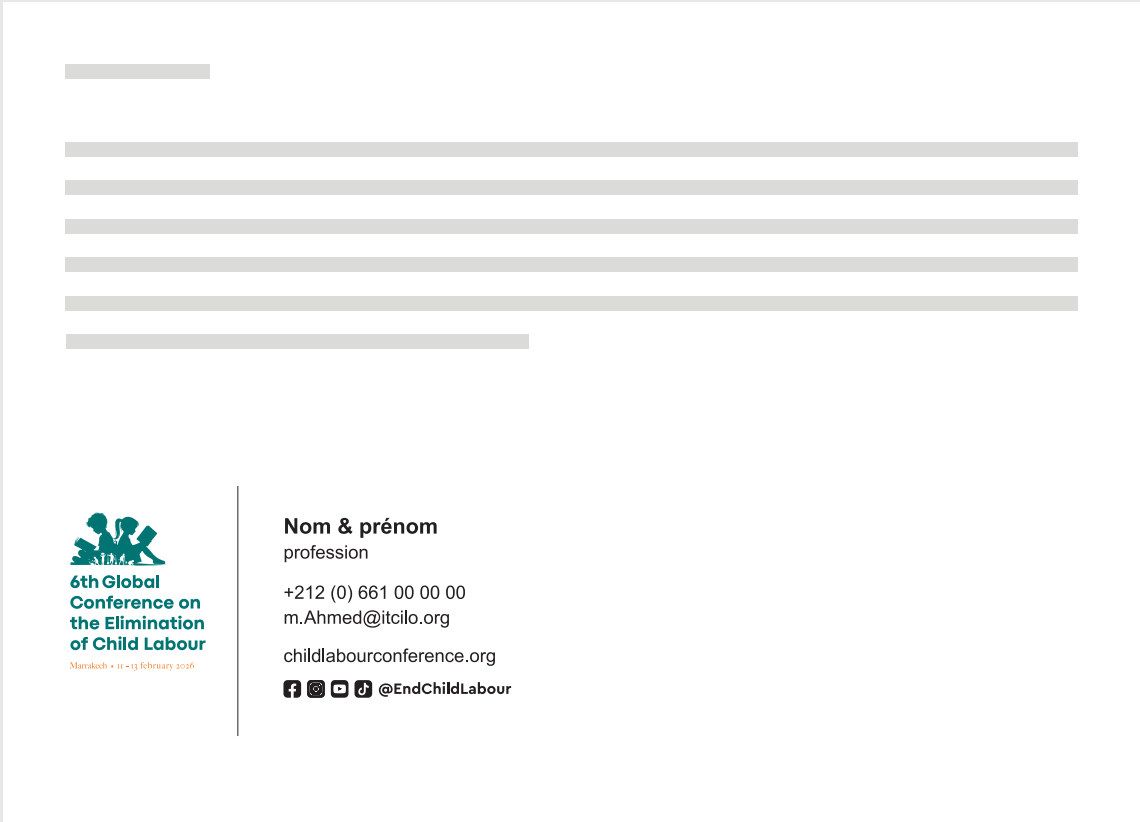
Signature
